# DISCOVERING DISCIPLESHIP

The order of service we follow today is a version of the historic liturgy of the Christian Church.

# INVOCATION<sup>1</sup>

- M: In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

# CONFESSION

- M: Dear friends, let us approach God with a true heart and confess our sins, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.
- C: Lord of life, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin. For faithless worrying and selfish pride, for sins of habit and sins of choice, For the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do, You should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.

# ABSOLUTION

- M: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. Hear the word of Christ through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

M: In peace, let us pray to the Lord.

#### C: Lord have mercy.

M: For the spread of your life giving gospel throughout the world, that all who are lost in sin may be brought to faith in you, hear our prayer, O Lord.

#### C: Christ, have mercy.

M: For patience and perseverance in this life, that we may not lose the hope of heaven as we await your return, hear our prayer, O Lord.

#### C: Lord, have mercy.

- M: Lord of life, live in us that we may live for you.
- C: Amen.

### FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 49:13-19

Isaiah foresaw a people who would have reason to worry, Jerusalem conquered, people and leaders exiled, the glory of Israel gone. But God's people could rejoice because he promised comfort and peace.

Shout for joy, you heavens; rejoice, you earth; burst into song, you mountains! For the LORD comforts his people and will have compassion on his afflicted ones. <sup>14</sup> But Zion said, The LORD has forsaken me, the Lord has forgotten me."

<sup>15</sup> "Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! <sup>16</sup> See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands; your walls are ever before me. <sup>17</sup> Your children hasten back, and those who laid you waste depart from you. <sup>18</sup> Lift up your eyes and look around; all your children gather and come to you. As surely as I live," declares the LORD, "you will wear them all as ornaments; you will put them on, like a bride. <sup>19</sup> "Though you were ruined and made desolate and your land laid waste, now you will be too small for your people, and those who devoured you will be far away.

# **PSALM OF THE DAY**

Psalm 37

David learned and teaches us not to fret because of the Lord's constant help and provision for us.

- M: Do not fret because of evil men or be envious of those who do wrong;
- C: For like the grass they will soon wither, like green plants they will soon die away.
- M: Trust in the Lord and do good; dwell in the land and enjoy safe pasture.
- C: Delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart.
- M: Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this:
- C: He will make your righteousness shine like the dawn, the justice of your cause like the noon day sun.
- M: I was young and now I am old, yet I have never seen the righteous forsaken or their children begging bread.
- C: Turn from evil and do good; then you will dwell in the land forever.
- M: For the Lord loves the just and will not forsake his faithful ones.

# C: The salvation of the righteous comes from the Lord; he is their stronghold in time of trouble.

- M: We commit ourselves to you, O Lord.
- C: Your faithfulness endures forever.

### SECOND LESSON

Philippians 4:6-20

### Paul is addressing the Philippians about anxiousness

<sup>6</sup>Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. <sup>7</sup>And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. <sup>9</sup>Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that once again you renewed your care for me. You were, in fact, concerned about me but lacked the opportunity to show it. <sup>11</sup> I don't say this out of need, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. <sup>12</sup> I know both how to have a little, and I know how to have a lot. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being content—whether well fed or hungry, whether in abundance or in need. <sup>13</sup> I am able to do all things through Him who strengthens me. <sup>14</sup> Still, you did well by sharing with me in my hardship.

<sup>15</sup> And you Philippians know that in the early days of the gospel, when I left Macedonia, no church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving except you alone. <sup>16</sup> For even in Thessalonica you sent gifts for my need several times. <sup>17</sup> Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the profit <sup>1</sup> that is increasing to your account. <sup>18</sup> But I have received everything in full, and I have an abundance. I am fully supplied, having received from Epaphroditus what you provided—a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. <sup>19</sup> And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus. <sup>20</sup> Now to our God and Father be glory forever and ever. 'Amen.

#### Matthew 6:24-34

#### GOSPEL

M: The Gospel according to Matthew chapter 6.

"No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.

# **Do Not Worry**

<sup>25</sup> "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? <sup>26</sup> Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? <sup>27</sup> Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

<sup>28</sup> "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. <sup>29</sup> Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. <sup>30</sup> If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? <sup>31</sup> So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' <sup>32</sup> For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. <sup>33</sup> But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. <sup>34</sup> Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

M: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

# ATHANASIAN CREED<sup>3</sup>

- M: Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith. Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever.
- C: Now this is the true Christian faith:
  We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God,
  Without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.
  For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct,
  but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one,
  equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.
- C: What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit. The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; The Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; The Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal;
- C: Yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal, just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.
- M: In the same way the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty; yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.
- C: So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; yet they are not three Gods, but one God.
- C: So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.
- M: For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God and Lord, so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.
- **C:** The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> This creed is named after St. Athanasius, a staunch defender of the Christian faith in the fourth century. It was prepared to assist the Church in combating two errors that undermined Bible teaching. One error denied that God's Son and the Holy Spirit are of one being or Godhead with the Father. The other error denied that Jesus Christ is true God and true man in one person. The Athanasian Creed continues to serve the Christian Church as a standard of the truth. It declares that whoever rejects the doctrine of the Trinity and the doctrine of Christ is without saving faith.

The section of the Athanasian Creed included here is the portion that confesses the Bible's teaching about the Triune God. This portion serves as a very fitting confession of faith for Trinity Sunday.

The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeds from the Father and the Son. So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

- M: And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior, but all three persons are coequal and coeternal,
- C: so that, in every way, as stated before, all three persons are to be worshipped as one God, and one God worshipped as three persons.
- M: Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.

The words below mark the beginning of the Sacrament section of the service and lift the worshipers' hearts in praise. The opening sentences are among the oldest in the Christian liturgy.


- M: The Lord be with you.

M: It is truly good and right that we should at all times and in all places give you thanks O Lord, holy Father, almighty and everlasting God, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who has called us to be his own so that we might live under him in his kingdom and serve him in everlasting innocence, righteousness and blessedness. Therefore with all the saints on earth, and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:


# WORDS OF INSTITUTION
