The Word

FIRST LESSON

Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

Daniel sees a snapshot of the judgement day scene

⁹ "As I looked, "thrones were set in place, and the Ancient of Days took his seat. His clothing was as white as snow; the hair of his head was white like wool. His throne was flaming with fire, and its wheels were all ablaze. ¹⁰ A river of fire was flowing, coming out from before him. Thousands upon thousands attended him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. The court was seated, and the books were opened.

¹³ "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, ^o coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. ¹⁴ He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

Our time on earth is short, Psalm 90 is a prayer to God to have compassion on us during our days here

¹ Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations.

² Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the earth and the world,

from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

³ You turn men back to dust, saying, "Return to dust, O sons of men."

⁴ For a thousand years in your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night.

⁵ You sweep men away in the sleep of death;

they are like the new grass of the morning—

⁶ though in the morning it springs up new,

by evening it is dry and withered.

⁷ We are consumed by your anger and terrified by your indignation.

⁸ You have set our iniquities before you,

our secret sins in the light of your presence.

⁹ All our days pass away under your wrath;

we finish our years with a moan.

¹⁰ The length of our days is seventy years—or eighty, if we have the strength;

yet their span is but trouble and sorrow,

for they quickly pass, and we fly away. ¹¹ Who knows the power of your anger? For your wrath is as great as the fear that is due you.

¹² Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.

¹³ Relent, O LORD! How long will it be? Have compassion on your servants.

¹⁴ Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love,

that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days.

¹⁵ Make us glad for as many days as you have afflicted us,

for as many years as we have seen trouble.

¹⁶ May your deeds be shown to your servants,

your splendor to their children.

¹⁷ May the favor of the Lord our God rest upon us;

establish the work of our hands for us yes, establish the work of our hands.



SECOND LESSON


God calls for repentance before facing his judgement

² Now we know that God's judgment against those who do such things is based on truth. ³ So when you, a mere human being, pass judgment on them and yet do the same things, do you think you will escape God's judgment? ⁴Or do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, forbearance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance?

⁵ But because of your stubbornness and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the day of God's wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed. ⁶ God "will repay each person according to what they have done." ^u ⁷ To those who by persistence in doing good seek glory, honor and immortality, he will give eternal life. ⁸ But for those who are self-seeking and who reject the truth and follow evil, there will be wrath and anger. ⁹ There will be trouble and distress for every human being who does evil: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile; ¹⁰ but glory, honor and peace for everyone who does good: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. ¹¹ For God does not show favoritism.

VERSE OF THE DAY

GOSPEL

please stand

M: The Gospel according to Matthew chapter 25.

Jesus' story is told as a reminder that we must constantly be ready, prepared. It was a common wedding practice in Jesus' day that when the groom had made arrangements for married life, he would go to the bride's family home to escort his bride to their new home. Then the wedding festivities began. Jesus story is to remind us to "keep watch" and prepare for the arrival of the Christ. He could arrive at any time

"At that time the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom.² Five of them were foolish and five were wise.³ The foolish ones took their lamps but did not take any oil with them.⁴ The wise ones, however, took oil in jars along with their lamps.⁵ The bridegroom was a long time in coming, and they all became drowsy and fell asleep.

⁶ "At midnight the cry rang out: 'Here's the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' ⁷ "Then all the virgins woke up and trimmed their lamps. ⁸ The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil; our lamps are going out.' ⁹ " 'No,' they replied, 'there may not be enough for both us and you. Instead, go to those who sell oil and buy some for yourselves.'

¹⁰ "But while they were on their way to buy the oil, the bridegroom arrived. The virgins who were ready went in with him to the wedding banquet. And the door was shut. ¹¹ "Later the others also came. 'Lord, Lord,' they said, 'open the door for us!' ¹² "But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I don't know you.' ¹³ "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour.

HYMN

Wake, Awake, For Night is Flying | 206

This hymn is often called the "King of Chorales." A majestic hymn written by Philip Nicolai was later turned into a magnificent choral piece by J.S. Bach. Listen to how the music masterfully matches the words of the hymn.





SERMON

³¹ "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. ³² All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. ³³ He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. ³⁴ "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.

³⁵ For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, ³⁶I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' ³⁷ "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? ³⁸ When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? ³⁹ When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' ⁴⁰ "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

⁴¹ "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. ⁴² For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, ⁴³ I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me.' ⁴⁴ "They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' ⁴⁵ "He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.' ⁴⁶ "Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."



BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE

Greetings everyone, I pray all is well with you. Last week we informed you on the progress of our loan request and that we are currently facing a gap of \$197,000 and any chance of closing this through grants of subsidies would be postponed to spring. This delay would also bring a risk of Pasco County requiring us to resubmit our Site Permit application which effectively would add another 5-6 months to our building process. Also waiting until spring to proceed will require us to obtain new pricing on the building, which could end up being better or worse. We reviewed this information with PRA, our Architect, and have submitted the building plans to two contractors, Schaefer Company and KB3-Group. Both of these companies have been actively pursuing opportunities to work with PRA. Pricing is due back from both firms on 11/13. If the pricing comes back favorable, we would begin work in January on our new church home. As always, pray for Gods blessings on our project.
