SERVICE NOTES

Today we thank God for those who risked, even lost their lives to stand up for the faith in Jesus Christ their Savior. The Church's commemoration of early martyrs dates back to the fourth century after Christ. The first connection to November 1 was is found in the English and Irish churches of the eighth century. Martin Luther chose the eve of All Saints' Day, October 31, to post his Ninety-Five Theses in Wittenberg, Germany because he wanted the crowds who would attend church on All Saints' Day to see the theses.

All Saints' Day is called <u>All</u> Saints' Day because on this day we also thank God for those who were Christian examples for us and passed the faith on to us, the next generation of Christians. We remember that we are saints too. Not because there is something special in and of ourselves, but because God made us saints when he created faith in us. We are saints before God through faith in the work of Jesus Christ. Martin Luther said, "The Bible calls us saints and the people of God. To forget that we are saints is to forget Christ and our baptism." God bless your worship today!

OPENING DIALOGUE

- **M:** Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. This is what the ancients were commended for. They admitted that they were aliens and strangers on earth. Instead, they were longing for a better country a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.
- C: Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.
- **M:** Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.

- C: I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God.
- **M:** We do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope.
- C: We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him.
- **M:** Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed in a flash in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.
- C: For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.
- **M:** Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor is not in vain.

FIRST LESSON

Revelation 7:9-17

The scene of victory and peace for the departed believers

fter this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb."

¹¹All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²saying: "Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!"

¹³Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" ¹⁴ I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. ¹⁵Therefore,

"they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them.
¹⁶Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst.
The sun will not beat upon them, nor any scorching heat.

¹⁷For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd;

he will lead them to springs of living water.

And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."


APOSTLES CREED

- M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- C: It is good and right so to do.
- M: Praise to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In love he has blessed us with every spiritual blessing. He sends the Holy Spirit to testify that we are his children and to strengthen us when we are weak. Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Christ. To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and thanks and honor and glory forever and ever.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION

M: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat. This is my + body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

PRAYER


